

KIDS CREATE AFTER SCHOOL ART ENRICHMENT PROGRAM AT ACS

These classes aim to teach free style, mixed media art concepts to youth through the works of famous artists. The curriculum being used is the Imagine That Program designed by the Modern Museum of Art in New York City. Students will create unique works of art that mirror the styles of historic artists. The mediums of creation will vary week to week depending on the classes focus. This course teaches both art history and artistic activities to children in a way that engages them and enriches their vision of the world around them. All supplies will be provided. *There is a limit of 20 children per class.* Each class will have a teacher and an assistant. Non-allergenic snacks will be provided.

Classes will be held on Thursdays January 12- February 2 after school from 4:00 – 5:00pm in the Art Room. Open to grades K – 6. The cost is \$60.00 per student. This is a 4 week program. Please have all enrollment forms and payment returned to the ACS front office no later than January 4th.

Class One - Salvador Dali: In this class we will be making collages inspired by Dali's famous painting, "The Persistence of Memory". The students will be crafting dreamlike images through the medium of collage. They will all be incorporating the double image theme into their work in the same way Dali did in his painting.

Class Two - Oppenheim: We will be making Fantasy Boxes. For this class we will be gathering together all those fun and colorful dust collectors that we attain from birthday party favor bags and Chuck E Cheese prize counters. With these objects we will build 3 dimensional, shadow box stories inside recycled box containers.

Class Three - Miro: We will be sculpting Make-Believe Creatures. Through the use of clay and objects from nature, the children will craft one of-a-kind sculptures. Prior to this class the students will have a scavenger list of ten things to find in nature.

Class Four – Oppenheim: We will be making make believe meals by changing the way ordinary things look. For example, part of a spaghetti dinner could be made from a strand of beads and red glitter.
