ELA

Math

7th:7th Grade students will be setting first quarter goals and tracking them over the first quarter, while learning the Google Products along the way: Forms, Maps, Docs, Sheets, and Sites. Students will be creating websites and blogging. January will also have MAP's testing. 8th: 8th grade students will continue to track their Stocks and work in learning how to create a complete workbook in Excel/Sheets. We will then move into the design process and create our own board games. January will also have MAP's testing.
