Middle School Update

6th Grade

6th grade is getting ready for Outdoor Ed on the 3rd -5th of October. The kids are getting really excited!

We are working on our Ancient Greece unit in social studies and working on the scientific method in science. We are reading Percy Jackson in reading and working hard with our daily grammar lessons.

ELA:

7th grade:

Science

7th grade is tracking Colorado's unpredictable weather and conducting their first lab on evaporation

8th grade will soon have their first quiz on motion and then move into forces.

Spanish

7th Grade students are moving into a new unit and will dive into activities and foods, which leads them into discussing what they like/don't like to do and eat!
8th Grade After a thorough review of unit 3, which is about foods, family and dates of events, we'll jump into Unit 4 of our curriculum!

Social Studies:

7th Grade is creating a Neolithic civilization based on the resources they have available geographically.

8th Grade is analyzing the philosophies on the Enlightenment and how they changed our relationship with government.

Math:

Course 2: We are still reviewing and reinforcing skills from the previous year. Students are reviewing fractions, decimals and percentages. We are using a compass and a protractor to inscribe a polygon.

Course 3: Students will be reviewing skills from the prior year. We will expand our knowledge of the Pythagorean theorem and learn some Pythagorean triples.

Algebra: We will start the year with foundational skills for algebra. We will review work habits and expectations. We will do much graphing this year. We are reviewing a function table, slope intercept form, and standard form of a linear function.

Tech:

7th Grade students have been learning the fundamentals of Microsoft word. In the coming weeks, we will open up some computers and learn the ins and outs of what makes them. We will also learn about cloud and network computing.

8th grade students have been showcasing what they know about Microsoft Word, and how to create instruction manuals on how to use advanced features. Along with Microsoft, we are working on iMovie to create an elevator speech...ask your student what their speech is going to be about.
